## **Aquatics**

Each year our year 5 and 6 students are involved in the Water Safety and Aquatics program at Pt Noarlunga



Beach. The year 5 students work in groups to learn about safety in the ocean. They get to experience activities in groups and learn how to help themselves and others when swimming at the beach. Students had a great time exploring the water, playing games in the surf and had a go at snorkeling.

Year 6 students have an opportunity to try different aquatic events. The activities they could choose included surfing, body boarding, stand up paddle boarding, kayaking and snorkeling. Students were able to work in small groups with trained instructors to stretch themselves and try new things. It was fantastic to see students standing up on paddle boards (and falling in), kayaking under the bridge and investigating the reef. Some students even saw a seahorse or two. Aquatics is a great way for students to experience new activities, communicate with new people and challenge themselves in the activities.

## **OSHC** News

#### **Term 1 Bookings**

Please let us know ASAP if you require bookings during the term, either permanent or casual to assist us with staffing.

If you require care for your child especially on a <u>Tuesday afternoon (early finish</u>) please notify us ASAP as we book out with 50 children almost every week, so the later booking time, the less chance you have of securing a spot. Once we reach capacity we are unable to accept any more children, due to licensing and staffing. Parents will be advised and children will be sent to the front office and need to be collected from there.

#### **Medical forms**

Please remember if your child requires medication or a puffer at OSHC you are required to provide <u>up to date</u> <u>medical plans from a GP as well as the medication</u>. <u>It is a legal requirement whilst they attend our service</u>. If these elements are not provided, the children will be unable to attend the service.

Please speak to Vanessa if you are unsure if your child's dates (plans or medication) have expired.

Don't forget to have a look at the Vacation Care program that is out now! We have lots of various activities for you child/dren including visitors, excursions and homebased days. If you have friends/ family from other schools they are also welcome to attend our service ©

#### **Cancellation Policy**

Just a reminder that we have a **no cancellation policy** regarding bookings. Unfortunately once you make the booking regardless if your child attends the session or is unwell and does not attend you will still be charged, however you are still eligible for CCS (and for most families) are only required to pay the gap payment.

I understand it is frustrating when children become ill on the day and therefore don't require the session however we still need to pay staff that have been booked to cover the staff to ratio legalities.

We are a service that is run purely on parent contributions (fees) and receive no government funding or support, therefore if fees are not paid and are asked to be cancelled without charge (by some parents) we then have to use the money to cover costs from the budgets of resources and food for the children.

So please (without offence) do not ask to cancel and not be charged for sessions on the day/ or the next day etc. If your family is going away in the future please notify me asap and I can change those bookings, however please understand I cannot cancel sessions for illness, as does other services such as child care etc who are in the same position.

#### Don't forget to notify us!

Just a friendly reminder to please let us know if your child is absent, on holidays, school crossing duty, school sports, on excursion, school transition visit, camp, traffic duty or something else to avoid us having to search the school for them. As you can imagine it is a busy time during afternoon arrivals and affects ratios if educators are out having to look for children that will be arriving late or are not at school!

#### Just a friendly reminder......

OSHC has a No cancellation policy, once booked and if you cancel, you will be charged for the session. If your child is unwell and will not be attending a booked session, please advise us as soon as possible as this saves considerable time looking for them after school has finished.

#### **Casual bookings**

Before School Care: Please advise staff before 7:00am prior to the session commencing. After School Care: Please advise OSHC before 2:30pm and advise the school office. Any walk in's will be charged a walk in fee of \$5.00 per child.
