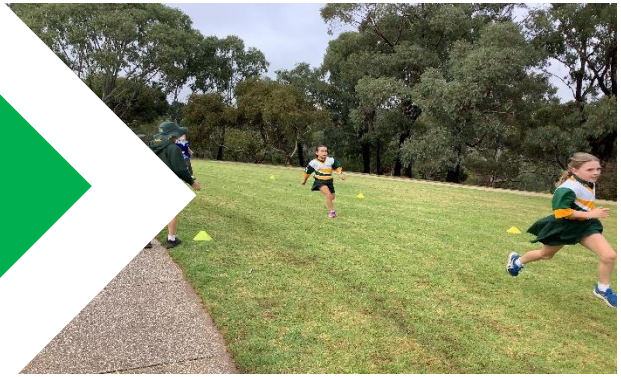

We had so much fun venturing out to various places, as well as welcoming visitors to our service and making the most of our homebased days. We look forward to seeing you all again in the July holidays, which will come around very quickly I'm sure!

New uniforms

Hopefully this week you have seen our educators wearing our new uniforms consisting of the school colours incorporated, so no more red! Black, green and white!

New seat

We now have a new comfortable bench seat outside of our OSHC building for parents/caregivers to utilise whilst waiting for children upon pick up. So feel free to sit down and enjoy the quick break!

New Casual booking fees

As of this term (2), Monday 1st May 2023 Casual booking rates will come into effect. These rates are inclusive of those who don't have permanent bookings at the service. They will be charged an additional \$5.00 per OSHC session, per child to accommodate last minute staffing, food supply and resources. BSC \$25.00 ASC \$35.00 (for those who are eligible for CCS this will be included in your subsidised amount). Permanent fees will remain the same at BSC \$20.00 and ASC \$30.00. Please don't hesitate to speak to Vanessa to discuss your bookings.

Term 2 Bookings

Please let us know ASAP if you require bookings during the term, either permanent or casual to assist us with staffing. If you require care for your child especially on a **Tuesday afternoon (early finish)** please notify us ASAP as we book out with 50 children almost every week, so the later booking time, the less chance you have of securing a spot. Once we reach capacity we are unable to accept any more children, due to licensing and staffing. Parents will be advised and children will be sent to the front office and need to be collected from there.

Medical forms

Please remember if your child requires medication or a puffer at OSHC you are required to provide **up to date medical plans from a GP as well as the medication. It is a legal requirement whilst they attend our service.** If these elements are not provided, the children will be unable to attend the service.

Please speak to Vanessa if you are unsure if your child's dates (plans or medication) have expired.

Cancellation Policy

Just a reminder that we have a **no cancellation policy** regarding bookings. Unfortunately once you make the booking regardless if your child attends the session or is unwell and does not attend you will still be charged, however you are still eligible for CCS (and for most families) are only required to pay the gap payment.

I understand it is frustrating when children become ill on the day and therefore don't require the session however, we still need to pay staff that have been booked to cover the staff to ratio legalities.

We are a service that is run purely on parent contributions (fees) and receive no government funding or support, therefore if fees are not paid and are asked to be cancelled without charge (by some parents) we then have to use the money to cover costs from the budgets of resources and food for the children.

So please (without offence) do not ask to cancel and not be charged for sessions on the day/ or the next day etc.

If your family is going away in the future please notify me asap and I can change those bookings, however please understand I cannot cancel sessions for illness, as does other services such as child care etc who are in the same position. Thank you to the families that continue to support our service 😊

Don't forget to notify us!

Just a friendly reminder to please let us know if your child is absent, on holidays, school crossing duty, school sports, on excursion, school transition visit, camp, traffic duty or something else to avoid us having to search the school for them. As you can imagine it is a busy time during afternoon arrivals and affects ratios if educators are out having to look for children that will be arriving late or are not at school!

Just a friendly reminder...

OSHC has a No cancellation policy, once booked and if you cancel, you will be charged for the session.

If your child is unwell and will not be attending a booked session, please advise us as soon as possible as this saves considerable time looking for them after school has finished.

Casual bookings

Before School Care: Please advise staff before 7:00am prior to the session commencing.

After School Care: Please advise OSHC before 2:30pm and then advise the school office. Bookings must be made through the OSHC service PRIOR to notifying the front office (as the staff are not responsible for staffing and ratios).

Any walk in's will be charged a walk in fee of \$5.00 per child
