Classroom News – Room 15

In room 15 we are building our fluency in mathematics using maths games.

These games require quick mental calculations, strategic thinking, and problem-solving skills. When using maths games students not only develop their mathematical skills but are also learning about teamwork and perseverance. As they compete against themselves, another player or join in small group challenges, students are gaining confidence in their abilities.

Here are a couple of games you can try at home. All you need is a pack of cards.

We call the first “Making 10 Snap”

To play you need 2 players. Each player gets half the pack. The picture cards are worth 10. The aim of the game is to lay 2 cards down (each player lays one in separate piles), if there is a 10 you shout snap and take the pile.

This one is “Doubles Snap”

You could also make traditional snap a little more challenging by having to say what the double is when added together if you elect to play the traditional number matching snap game.

LEARNING OUTCOME:

OUTCOME 1 - CHILDREN HAVE A STRONG SENSE OF IDENTITY.

Last weeks theme allowed us to explore the wonderful world of Superheroes!

It allowed us to engage in conversations about our favourite superheroes and what super powers we would have if we were superheroes. Lots of children expressed they'd love to be able to fly, while others wanted to be invisible to sneak up and make people jump!

OUTCOME 5 - CHILDREN ARE EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATORS

Collection of children

Please remember the service has a duty of care and legal responsibility when dismissing children from our care. Only those who have been authorised to collect children with parent permission are stated on the enrolment form. If another person attends the service the child will not be released into their care unless verbal permission has been given over the phone prior by the parent and an ID check has been completed on the person attending the service.

Please understand that we have several educators that work across the service at different times and days so they may not have seen the person before who has been sent to collect the child. ID will be asked.

If this is the case we ask that you respectfully provide your ID for verification to ensure the safety of the child.

Also, if you are dropping your child off in the morning you need to escort your child to the front door to ensure a hand over has been completed. It is not acceptable to drop them in the car park and leave.

We appreciate your understanding with these matters to ensure everyone's safety!
