Where are we at?

We are now in the thick of the school year. The healthy relationships we have forged with students will be fortified—and tested—as we plan for our students to meet ambitious academic goals. We aim for a trauma-informed, strengths-based practice that is relational. It holds students steady, particularly when hitting those everyday speedbumps of learning new content and new skills. We are constantly working to build our strategies to increase a culture of belonging and classroom community, and to develop new resources to share with your children.

Morning circle

A priority inclusion strategy at our school...



The first 5 minutes of class are critical for setting the tone for the rest of the learning. Consistent rhythms and routines, particularly ones that embed intentional positive micromoments, are powerful healing interventions as they "help build confidence that positive events will occur and ...flexibility when unexpected events are encountered" (Brunzell, 2016). Welcome circles nurturing routines that support engagement in learning and wellbeing – are a key strategy for consistently embedding strengths and also tending to the body and relational connection.

This routine of forming a circle with our young people to review key values and expectations and celebrate any announcements and successes, serves as a threshold between the outside world and the complex task of learning. It allows young people to ground themselves, co-regulate and establish a common rhythm for the learning day. At Sheidow we take the time to check in and connect with our students, we are not only setting them up to get much more out of the learning, but we are providing an opportunity for us, as educators, to get on the front foot of any potential issues that may present as speedbumps for learning.

We have been preparing for our Winter celebrations as part of our Steiner curriculum. We celebrate winter by acknowledging the inner light in our selves and in our community.

LEARNING OUTCOME:

OUTCOME 3 - CHILDREN HAVE A STRONG SENSE OF WELLBEING

Last week's theme we explored a range of different sports, well we did the best we could with the weather we got!

We did have to improvise a little and alter our sports to make them playable in the OSHC hall on some afternoons as the weather wasn't playing ball! We utilised the basketball hoop inside and set up a mini court for children to play.



We set up an indoor soccer challenge using a soft ball attached to the boxing bag bracket and children had 1 minute to get as many points as they could - 1 point for the yellow wall and 5 points for the white section. This definitely allowed for some friendly competition with the most challenging part was for the educators trying to keep tally of all the points!
