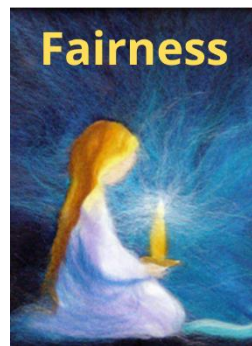

We love to celebrate our students – here's another way we can...

The Character component of the Berry Street Education model harnesses a values and character strengths approach to instil students' self-knowledge for future pathways. The way we act on and live into our values are known as 'character strengths'. Berry Street has identified 24 character strengths, which are grouped into six categories: Wisdom and knowledge, Courage, Humanity, Justice, Temperance, and Transcendence.

We have decided to take six of these character strengths and celebrate students who demonstrate them in the classroom or yard at recess and lunch. If a teacher or SSO recognises a student is demonstrating kindness, gratitude, leadership, forgiveness, teamwork or fairness they will be given a little card to say thank you. The student can take this home as a keepsake to remember their positive contribution to our school.

Modesty and humility	Letting accomplishments speak for themselves.
Prudence	Exercising caution, thinking about the things you say before you say them.
Self-regulation (self-control)	Having discipline and regulating your feelings and actions.
Appreciation of beauty	Noticing and appreciating excellence and beauty.
Spirituality	Having a strong sense that there is a higher purpose to life.
Leadership	Having vision, and organising and leading people.
