## AND WISE!

### **Grounding Techniques (Part 1)**

It is normal for children (and adults at times) to experience big feelings, possibly anxiety, stress, fear, anger and/or other emotions from time to time. Grounding techniques are a great way to help control these experiences by turning our attention away from thoughts, memories, or worries, and refocusing on the present moment.

STRATEGY 1: 5-4-3-2-1 Technique: Using the 5-4-3-2-1 technique, you will purposefully take in details of your surroundings using each of your senses. Strive to notice small details that your mind would usually tune out, such as distant sounds, or the texture of an ordinary object.

> What are 5 things you can see? Look for small details such as a pattern on the ceiling, the way light reflects off a surface, or an object you never noticed.



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What are 4 things you can feel? Notice the sensation of clothing on your body, the sun on your skin, or the feeling of the chair you are sitting in. Pick up an object and examine its weight, texture, and other physical qualities.



What are 3 things you can hear? Pay special attention to the sounds your mind has tuned out, such as a ticking clock, distant traffic, or trees blowing in the wind.



What are 2 things you can smell? Try to notice smells in the air around you, like an air freshener or freshly mowed grass. You may also look around for something that has a scent, such as a flower or an unlit candle.



What is 1 thing you can taste? Carry gum, candy, or small snacks for this step. Pop one in your mouth and focus your attention closely on the flavors.

STRATEGY 2: Categories: Choose at least three of these categories below and name as many items as you can in each one. Spend a few minutes on each category to come up with as many items as possible.

For a variation on this activity, try naming items in a category alphabetical. For example, for the fruits and vegetables category, say "apple, banana, carrot", and so on.


### Classroom News - Room 1 / Class 4

This increase has not been introduced for the last 3 years to help support families and the community through the cost of living.

Families are still entitled to their Child Care Subsidy (CCS) and will receive their allocated entitlements off of the new fee structure.

### THE NEW MID-YEAR INTAKE TO RECEPTION STARTS IN 2024.

In South Australia, the first year of primary school is called reception.

From 2024, children who turn 5 years old:

- before 1 May can start school in term 1
- between 1 May and 31 October can start school in term 3 (mid-year intake)
- after 31 October can start the next year.

Children who start school at the beginning of the year will complete 4 terms of reception.

Children who start school in a mid-year intake will complete 6 terms of reception.



Registrations of interest are now open to start school in the 2024 mid-year intake.


