Relational Strategies...

Wellbeing at Sheidow Park looks at many different relational strategies that we use with our students. Over the next few newsletters I will begin to unpack some of these with you.



Separate the student from their behaviour

Ensure when talking about a student, describe the behaviour as separate from the student. This allows you to think clearly, and proactively about what to do next. Acknowledging every student's humanity helps us to see a student who wants to belong and succeed.

Remember that a student is much more than their struggles. As educators, we are holding space for who they are becoming. It takes time to help them meet their own needs in healthy ways. Reframe their struggles as the student is not there yet. Consider how you can care for these needs and be present for them throughout this student's learning journey.



When witnessing a student's stress behaviours, reflect on what developmental milestones has this student missed? How can you provide experiences to build their capacity for growth?



Working from a place of unconditional positive regard means that you can be honest with students and provide constructive, fix-it feedback to show you are there for them.

Students know when staff talk down to them, judge them or embarrass them. Calling someone out with a foundation of unconditional positive regard reminds students that you are on their side, can see them for who they are, and want to help them reach their goals.



Unconditional Positive Regard

Teacher-student connections and relationships are built on the attachment principle of unconditional positive regard. Unconditional positive regard facilitates an environment where the student feels valued regardless of their presenting behaviours, affect or cognitions. Rather than looking to others for identity and approval, the student is encouraged to learn and listen to themselves. Maintaining unconditional positive regard for a struggling student can be far more difficult in practice. Often these students may trigger our own sense of helplessness and loss of control. Here are four steps teachers use to stay in a relational space with a struggling student:

- 1. Separate the student from their behaviour.
- 2. Maintain a vision of the child's wholeness.
- 3. Recall thwarted pathways of child development.
- 4. Call them out with love in your voice.

Attachment and Attunement

Attachment can be defined as an enduring relationship with another person such as a parent, carer teacher or friend that i characterized by soothing, comfort, pleasure or safety (Ludy-Dobson & Perry, 2010). Attachment based relationships are built upon foundations of safety, compassion, and the sequential skills of maintaining and valuing relationships. The classroom environment presents many opportunities to take healthy risks. Teachers create authentic relationships with students that effectively invite students to immerse themselves in learning challenges.

Attachment strategies between teacher and student include:

- 1. A relationship based on soothing, comfort and safety.
- 2. An environment centred on security, worthiness and belonging.
- 3. Attached relationships that are a powerful form of physical regulation.
- 4. Students learning how to handle stress and adversity from their attached adult role-models.
- 5. Attuned relationships that require as many 'side-by-side' interactions as possible.



Thursday May 16th from 7:00pm ASCT via zoom.



Term 2 Bookings

After hours sports/ clubs on school grounds

Please note: if your child will be attending sports training/ chess club/ running etc the service needs to be notified and a sports release form needs to be completed by the parent prior to the child/ren leaving the service to attend. This is also required if the child is booked into OSHC and goes straight to the sport/group etc as we need to ensure we are aware of the child's location for everyone's safety. Forms are to be collected from the service. Please discuss with Vanessa if you have any questions.

Updating Medical forms and Medication

Please ensure the service has an updated medication and action plan for your child. This is a legal requirement whilst they attend our service. Care cannot be provided unless these elements are in date. Please contact Vanessa if you are unsure of the dates/ situation of your child's medication and plans.

OSHC Fees

A reminder that the service requires fortnightly payments made to accounts. These do not always have to be the full amount owing, but something needs to be added regularly. Once an account reaches \$100 it is our policy to send a text message to remind families to please make a payment. If nothing is received a reminder letter will be sent and your child will be unable to attend the service until a payment is received.

We understand that times are tough and encourage you to speak to Vanessa if you are having financial difficulties or need to organise a payment plan.

Year 6 information - Starting High School 2025



Year 6 Students ONLY - Registration of interest for students starting secondary school in 2025

Year 6 Students – registration of interest for high school – 2025

A new online registration of interest form is now available for parents of students starting secondary school in 2025 to complete.

An email was sent to you with your unique link for your child.

If you haven't received it please contact Jodie in the front office so she can email you again please.

The form can be accessed from a computer, tablet or mobile phone, as long as you can connect to the internet, and replaces the old paper format used by schools, sometimes referred to as an ED176 form. It is recommended that you use Chrome as your internet browser to complete this form.

The online form will allow you to tell the department if: you would like your child to attend their local/zoned secondary school (find which secondary school is your local/zoned one at find a school) you are interested in your child attending another SA government secondary school/s your child does not require a place as they will not be attending a SA government secondary school in 2025

You must complete and submit the form by 26th May 2024.

Where appropriate, the link to this unique form has been sent to each person who has legal responsibility for your child. It is important that parents/guardians reach an agreement regarding which secondary school(s) you want to nominate for your child before you complete the form, as only one form can be submitted for each child.

If you need to make changes after the form has been submitted, you will need to contact our office at Sheidow Park Primary School.

All families will be advised of their child's secondary school allocation on or by 9th August 2024.


