We are committed to genuine student agency at Sheidow Park School and are continuously looking for opportunities for students to have a voice and positively impact their learning journey and engagement at school.


I'm pleased to be able to let our community know that we are able to now offer voice lessons from the beginning of term 3 through Emerald Voices. Please see the information below if you are interested.

Relational Strategies (PART 2)...

Last week we looked at two of the relational strategies we use at Sheidow Park. These were Unconditional Positive Regard – the ability to look beyond the behavior, and Attachment and Attunement – connection before correction. This week we will look at the concept of Redefining Personal Power.



Redefining Personal Power

We value expressions of power by teachers from a pro-social lens. Examples of these include:

- **Expert power** (subject matter and teaching expertise)
- **Reward power** (positive feedback)
- Referent power (relational, empathetic and connected).

The use of these pro-social expressions of power by teachers have been associated with improved student outcomes. We like exploring issues and expressions of personal power with students and believe that all young people should feel affirmed for wanting control over their own lives.


Our discussion of personal power is closely linked to the concept of having **choices**. These discussions can be explored through the lens of being 'present, centred and ready to learn'. The more empowerment you accrue, the more choices you have.

We share power with students when we:

- Develop a positive sense of community
- Share decision making with students
- Use engaging classroom practices
- Value student leadership (from all students)
- Embrace diversity.

We share power with parents when we:

- Ask opinions
- Create a welcoming school/classroom culture
- Keep you informed
- Acknowledge your 'funds of knowledge'
- Honour the uniqueness of 'parent knowledge'

Thank you to Patrick (teacher), Pene, Jennie and Ian for volunteering on the day - we couldn't have done it with out your help so thank you again.













Cultural Activities



Voice Lessons Expression of Interest

Dear parents and vocalists,

As a fellow Sheidow Park parent, I am delighted to introduce myself as the visionary of a new endeavor for the school. Whether our children are enrolled in Steiner or Mainstream, we have all chosen Sheidow Park for their creative and innovative approach to learning. Music is a strong thread, woven throughout the learning process, especially for those who resonate with creative arts. As a musician myself, I have been particularly impressed with the musical opportunities provided by Sheidow Park as a teaching tool along with a separate learning experience. We are now fortunate enough to have another option for musical learning in the form of singing/voice lessons. I have been teaching singing for the past eighteen years to students from the age of 1 – 100. As a lifelong learner, I have continued to build on what I am able to offer my students by studying the renowned Estill method of voice along with a Speech Pathology degree. I can now use a fusion of musical creativity and more science based understanding of the voice and speech to deliver voice lessons tailored to each individual students' needs and creative expression. It is an honour to be able to offer your children the chance to access my unique voice lessons at the school. Below is a form for you to respond with your expression of interest if you have a budding singer at home, or if you feel your child would benefit from speech and voice work through the medium of music. The details of my lessons are as follows:

- Each lesson is held for 30 minutes once a week during school hours.
- Lessons can be individual or small group.
- I work on a rotating timetable to ensure students don't miss the same subject each week.
- > Lesson times can be negotiated with me directly.
- Lessons are invoiced directly from myself to parents.
- Lesson rates are at \$25/private lesson, \$13/semi-private student (2 students), or \$9/group student (3+ students).
- Lessons are able to start from term 3 with the day to be determined.



Uniform



Uniform Policy

Effective Term 3, 2022

Background

At Sheidow Park School all students wear the school uniform. This decision and specific uniform requirements have been endorsed by Governing Council. Leadership may exempt a student from wearing uniform on certain grounds.

Colour code and items of uniform

The school dress code stipulates that students must wear

- · bottle green or white on the upper body
- · bottle green or black on the lower body

If a student is wearing black bottoms they MUST wear a green top in order to avoid wearing a black and white uniform.

*We are transitioning to a new logo. The old logo may still be worn until the end of 2025. It is not compulsory to wear clothing that has the school logo however wearing the logo is encouraged





Unacceptable clothing items

- any logo or messaging other than the school logo
- jeans
- open toed footwear, clogs, slides, sandals, thongs, high heeled shoes, fashion boots, ugg boots, and gum boots are unacceptable footwear in the classroom
- black clothing on the upper body
- leggings /active wear as pants



Acceptable clothing items in BOTTLE GREEN

- · check/tartan winter or summer dress
- polo or round neck t-shirt
- short, skirt, cullote or skort
- skivvy
- windcheater/jumper, zip up jacket
- · bike short or leggings/tights
- · track pant
- · cargo or other similar type pant

bike shorts or leggings/tights are ONLY to be worn under skirts or dresses

Acceptable clothing items in WHITE

- · polo or round neck t-shirt
- skivvy

Acceptable clothing styles in BLACK

- · short, skirt, culotte, skort
- · bike short or leggings/tights
- track pant
- · cargo pant or other similar pant

bike shorts or leggings/tights are ONLY to be worn under skirts or dresses

black shirt, skivvy, jumper or jacket is not part of the dress code



Hats/Beanies

The school has a 'no hat no play' policy in place during terms 1, 3 and 4. During term 2, a hat is mandatory when the UV rating is 3 and above.

Wearing a hat is an important part of the dress code. The Cancer Council recommends a wide brimmed, bucket or legionnaire style hat. Hats with graffiti, or hats that are torn or tattered are not acceptable. Hats with cords are unsafe and must not be worn.

During winter, only plain green or school beanie with logo will be acceptable.

Jackets/Parker

A bottle green jacket is the only acceptable colour.





Jewellery, makeup and accessories

- hair ties, scrunchies and headbands in bottle green or white is preferred
- tattoos, facial makeup and coloured nail polish are not acceptable
- dangly earrings and bracelets are considered unsafe and must not be worn

Shoes/Socks

Children are involved in fitness and/or PE lessons most days and play outside at recess and lunch so appropriate footwear is essential. Leather shoes and track shoes (sneakers) are recommended footwear for the school.

If socks are clearly visible they are to be bottle green, white or black to match the rest of the uniform.

OSHC News



We have a Pupil Free Day at the end of week 6- Friday 7th of June. Please let us know ASAP if you require care for your child/ren on this day to ensure adequate staffing can be met.

After hours sports/ clubs on school grounds

Please note: if your child will be attending sports training/ chess club/ running etc the service needs to be notified and a sports release form needs to be completed by the parent prior to the child/ren leaving the service to attend. This is also required if the child is booked into OSHC and goes straight to the sport/group etc as we need to ensure we are aware of the child's location for everyone's safety. Forms are to be collected from the service. Please discuss with Vanessa if you have any questions.

Changes to Cancellation policy

We have made a change to our cancellation policy, in which prior the policy stated any booking was charged regardless of attendance or absence. The new policy states that cancellations can be made with 48 hours notice to a permanent or casual booking without charge. This change commences, Monday 3rd June 2024.

New Charge/ policy

We ask that parents notify us if their child will be absent from the ASC session, or picked up prior to school finishing etc to prevent us from having to search the school from them. A 'no show/non-communication' fee of \$5.00 will be charged to each family's account if no notice is received. This change commences, Monday 3rd June 2024.

OSHC Fees

A reminder that the service requires fortnightly payments made to accounts. These do not always have to be the full amount owing, but something needs to be added regularly. Once an account reaches \$100 it is our policy to send a text message to remind families to please make a payment. If nothing is received a reminder letter will be sent and your child will be unable to attend the service until a payment is received.

We understand that times are tough and encourage you to speak to Vanessa if you are having financial difficulties or need to organise a payment plan.
